



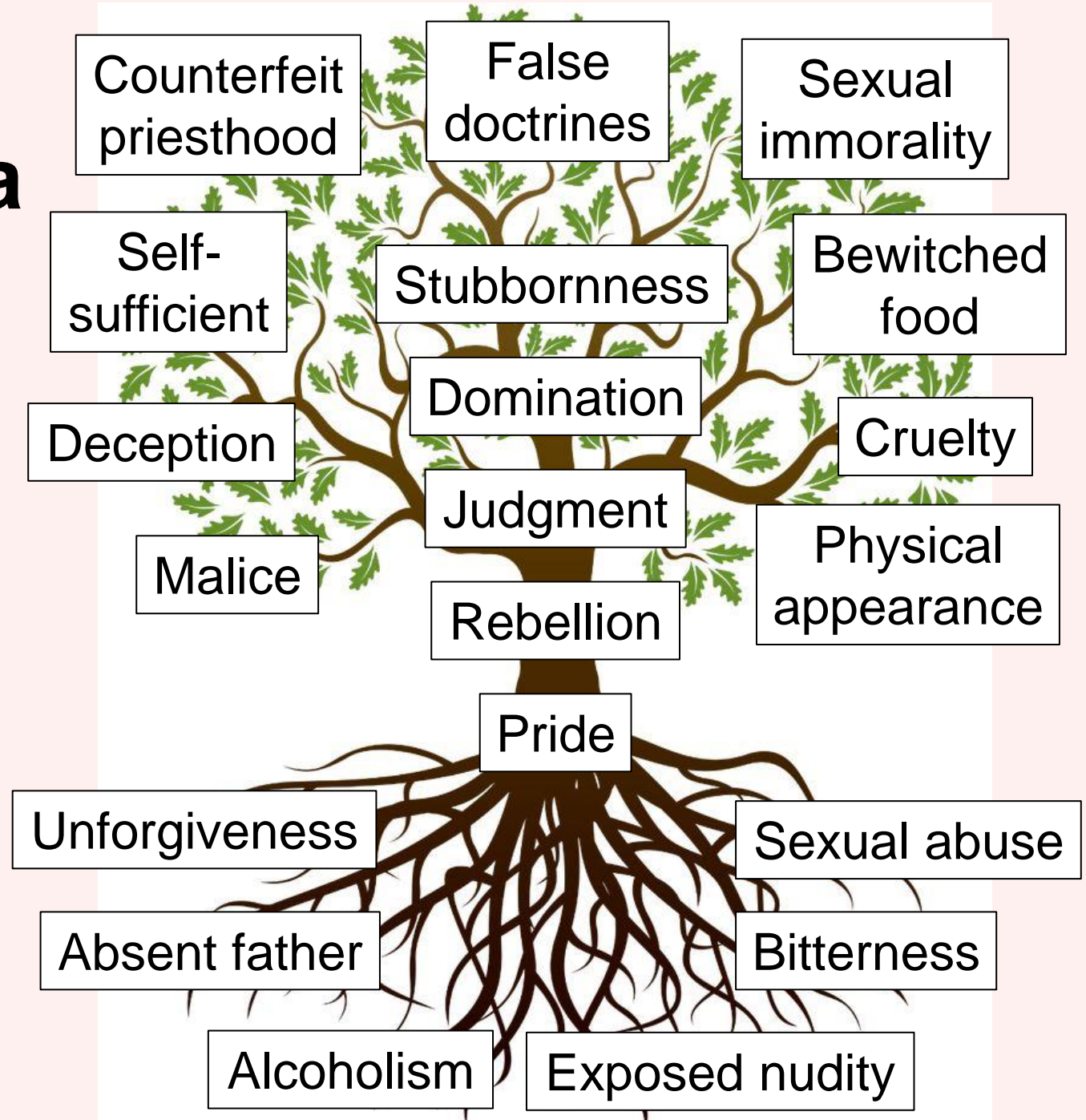

A single missing ingredient can affect the outcome



Don't focus on others' faults

And why worry about a speck in your friend's eye when you have a log in your own? Missing a healing

*Now Naaman was commander of the army of the king of Aram. He was a great man in the sight of his master and highly regarded, because through him the LORD had given victory to Aram. He was a valiant soldier, **but he had leprosy.***

So Naaman went with his horses and chariots and stopped at the door of Elisha's house. Elisha sent a messenger to say to him, "Go, wash yourself seven times in the Jordan, and your flesh will be restored and you will be cleansed."

But Naaman went away angry and said, "I thought that he would surely come out to me and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God, wave his hand over the spot and cure me of my leprosy. Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Couldn't I wash in them and be cleansed?" So he turned and went off in a rage.

2 Kings 5:1, 9-12 (NIVUK)

Missing a name (character) change

“Your name will no longer be Jacob,” the man told him. “From now on you will be called Israel, because you have fought with God and with men and have won.”

Genesis 32:28 (NLT)

*After **Jacob** returned from Paddan Aram, God appeared to him again and blessed him. God said to him, “Your name is Jacob, but you will no longer be called Jacob; your name will be Israel.” So He named him Israel.*

Genesis 35:9-10 (NIVUK)

*As she breathed her last – for she was dying – she named her son Ben-Oni. **But his father named him Benjamin.***

*So **Rachel died** and was buried on the way to Ephrath (that is, Bethlehem). Over her tomb **Jacob** set up a pillar, and to this day that pillar marks Rachel’s tomb.*

***Israel** moved on again...*

Genesis 35:18-21a (NIVUK)

Missing a character trait: bake a little longer!

*But when all goes well with you, remember **me** and show **me** kindness; mention **me** to Pharaoh and get **me** out of this prison. **I** was forcibly carried off from the land of the Hebrews, and even here **I** have done nothing to deserve being put in a dungeon.*

Genesis 40:14-15 (NIVUK)

When two full years had passed...

Pharaoh said to Joseph, “I had a dream, and no one can interpret it. But I have heard it said of you that when you hear a dream you can interpret it.”

“I cannot do it,” Joseph replied to Pharaoh, ***“but God will give Pharaoh the answer he desires.”***

Genesis 41:1a, 15-16 (NIVUK)

Missing a revelation

*Then a voice said to him, “**What are you doing here, Elijah?**”*

*He replied, “I have been very zealous for the LORD God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, torn down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. **I am the only one left**, and now they are trying to kill me too.”*

*The LORD said to him, “**Go back** the way you came, and go to the Desert of Damascus. When you get there, anoint Hazael king over Aram. Also, anoint Jehu son of Nimshi king over Israel, and anoint Elisha son of Shaphat from Abel Meholah to succeed you as prophet. Jehu will put to death any who escape the sword of Hazael, and Elisha will put to death any who escape the sword of Jehu. **Yet I reserve seven thousand in Israel** – all whose knees have not bowed down to Baal and whose mouths have not kissed him.”*

1 Kings 19:13b-18 (NIVUK)

Missing a ministry partner

Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, and when he found him, he brought him to Antioch. So for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch.

Acts 11:25-26 (NIVUK)

Now when I went to Troas to preach the gospel of Christ and found that the Lord had opened a door for me, I still had no peace of mind, because I did not find my brother Titus there. So I said goodbye to them and went on to Macedonia.

2 Corinthians 2:12-13 (NIVUK)

Missing one thing in your life

As Jesus started on his way, a man ran up to Him and fell on his knees before Him. "Good teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

"Why do you call me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good – except God alone. You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, you shall not defraud, honour your father and mother.'"

*"Teacher," he declared, "all these I have kept since I was a boy." **Jesus looked at him and loved him. "One thing you lack,"** He said. "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow Me."*

At this the man's face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth.

Desiring one thing
